

THE PROPHETS: God's "covenant enforcers" who delivered messages to Israel when she was in revolt against God and his covenant requirements.







MICAH 6:6-8—GETTING TO THE HEART OF OLD TESTAMENT LAW (AND ITS GIVER)

Micah 6:1-8

- Listen to what the Lord says:
 "Stand up, plead your case before the mountains;
 - let the hills hear what you have to say. Hear, O mountains, the LORD's accusation;
 - listen, you everlasting foundations of the earth.
 - For the LORD has a case against his people; he is lodging a charge against Israel.
- ³ "My people, what have I done to you? How have I burdened you? Answer me.
- I brought you up out of Egypt and redeemed you from the land of slavery.
 - I sent Moses to lead you, also Aaron and Miriam.
- My people, remember what Balak king of Moab counseled and what Balaam son of Beor answered. Remember your journey from Shittim to Gilgal, that you may know the righteous acts of the LORD."
